RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

Entry Forms

All entry forms must be submitted through your USATF Regional Coordinator at your Regional Junior Olympic Championship. **Entries cannot be accepted by any other method.** Your regional coordinator must verify all entry forms for completeness and accuracy. The birth date submitted must be **verified** and stamped as such by either the Association Chairman, the Regional Coordinator or an acceptable form of **'proof of age'** must be attached to the entry form that is submitted. Entry forms not meeting all of these requirements will be deemed incomplete and will only be processed after all missing information is provided along with an additional \$10.00 incomplete entry fee. **There are no late entries for this competition.**

Packet Pick-Up

Athletes will be able to pick up their competition numbers and related materials from Monday, July 23 through Sunday, July 29 at the CSUS Alumni Center, located near the stadium. This will be the only location for packet pick-up. Packet pick-up will be available from 7:00 AM through 7:00 PM daily. Hold on to your race numbers! There will be a \$5.00 charge for replacement of all lost race numbers.

Athlete's Check-In Time for Events

There will be separate check-in areas for Running and Field events located in the warm-up areas (refer to site map). Athletes must check into these designated areas 45 minutes prior to the event's scheduled starting time. All athletes will be required to remain in the designated warm-up areas after checking in.

Implements

All implements in the throwing events (shot, discus, javelin and mini-javelin) will be provided by the meet management. Personal implements in the throwing events will not be allowed at the field venues.

Warm-up Facilities

The competition track at the stadium will not be available for warm-up at any time. The warm-up track at the stadium will be available for warm-up when there is no competition session. The warm-up track will be secured during competition for final warm-ups and stretching. No coaches will be allowed in the warm-up area. Coaches and spectators will be allowed in competition areas of the warm-up track during the combined event competition on July 24th and 25th.

Spike Length

The maximum spike length allowed for field events is (7.0mm). For all track events, pyramid spikes (7.0mm) will be the largest permitted. No PIN spikes will be allowed on the competition or warm-up tracks. Spikes will be available for sale in the fan expo.

Starting Heights

The starting height for the high jump and the pole vault will be per USATF rule 242.5(k). Incremental increases will be 5cm in the high jump and 15cm in the pole vault.

Protest Table

All protests must be submitted in writing within thirty (30) minutes after the results of an event are posted per rule 73. This time period will be strictly enforced. There will be a \$100.00 cash submission fee required to file a protest. This fee will be refunded only if the protest is upheld. Only violations of the USATF 2001 Rules of Competition may be

protested. Judgment calls made by meet officials cannot be protested. Protests that do not meet the above criteria will not be accepted. A protest table will be next to place where the results are posted (see site map on pages 8 & 9).

Posted Results

Posted results are for the benefit of everyone. Please do not remove result sheets in order to support your protest. Individual results, and results books will be available daily for sale in the posted results areas.

Opening Ceremonies

Athletes, Coaches, Officials, and spectators are invited to our Opening Ceremony at the 2001 National Junior Olympic Championships, Wednesday, July 25, 7:00 P.M. at the stadium. The Opening Ceremony will feature a parade of athletes by region, keynote speakers, and other exciting moments for fans of all ages. Participants in the parade are asked to report to the warm-up facility at the stadium at 6:00 P.M. wearing their uniforms. More information will be available in the athlete packets at the competition.

Awards

Awards will be formally presented approximately 45 minutes after the conclusion of each final event. Award recipients will be encouraged to go to a special holding area to await presentations.

Medical Services

There will be a doctor available at all sessions of the championships as well as certified trainers and other medical volunteers to meet athlete and spectator needs. Additional medical facilities are within ten minutes of the stadium and there will be emergency transportation available, on site, at all times.

Stadium Rules

—Tents—

Tents may only be set up on the upper half of the eastside grandstands. This includes sections 200-208. Tents must be broken down and removed from the stadium at the completion of competition each day. LOC is not responsible for lost or stolen items. NO TENTS MAY BE LEFT OVERNIGHT.

—Alcohol—

There is no alcohol permitted in the stadium.

—Smoking—

The stadium is a SMOKE FREE ZONE. There is no smoking allowed inside the stadium.

—Coolers—

Coolers are permitted inside the stadium; however, coolers may not contain glass containers. Coolers will be checked at the gate. Please remove any items that you brought in the stadium with you.

Admission

Coaches who have a valid 2001 USA Track & Field Coach's Membership Card will be admitted to the competition site free of charge. They will be provided with a special pass for entry on all days. This pass is for admission only and does not provide for special access to the competition venues. Coaches may obtain this pass at Packet Pick-up in the CSUS Alumni Center. Coaches Membership Cards alone do not provide admission to the stadium, you must present your card to Packet Pick-up to obtain an admission pass. Coaches must show a valid picture ID in order to obtain the pass. They will be provided with one pass only.

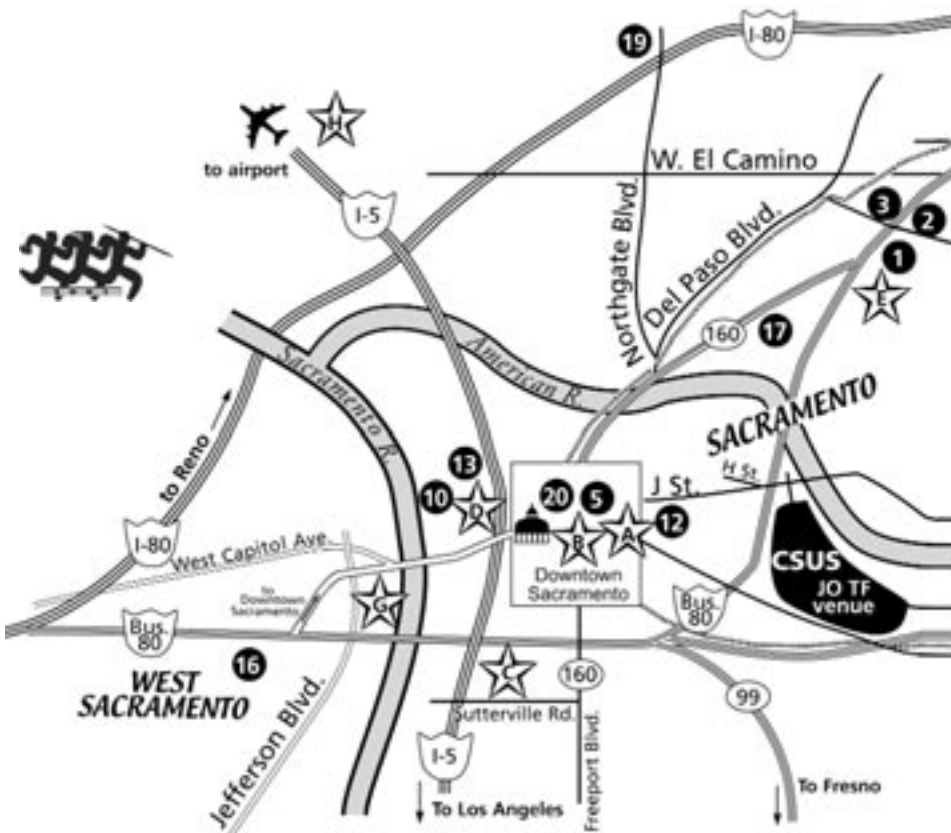

Cost of admission to the meet is \$5 per day for adults and \$2 per day for noncompeting children under the age of 13. Four-day passes will be available for \$15 for adults and \$6 for noncompeting children under the age of 13.

There is no admission charge for the combined event competition held on June 24th and 25th.

Parking

There will be plenty of free parking available at the competition site in designated areas. Please use these areas only as other areas of the parking lot will be reserved for officials, meet organizers, and students enrolled in the University. If you do not park in designated areas your vehicle may be cited and/or towed.

RV parking will be available during the competition, however, RVs will not be permitted to park overnight and will be directed to the Cal Expo RV Park, a short 10 minute drive from the stadium. For information on overnight RV parking, contact the Cal Expo RV Park at (916) 263-3187. Cal Expo RV Park offers full hookups at every site as well as 30 and 50 Amp service.

Food Services

Concessions will be sold throughout the stadium. You may bring your own food and drink into the stadium but you may not bring in glass containers. When you leave you must remove anything you brought in with you.

There will be an official meet photographer during all sessions of the Junior Olympics. Information regarding obtaining meet photographs will be available in the fan expo.

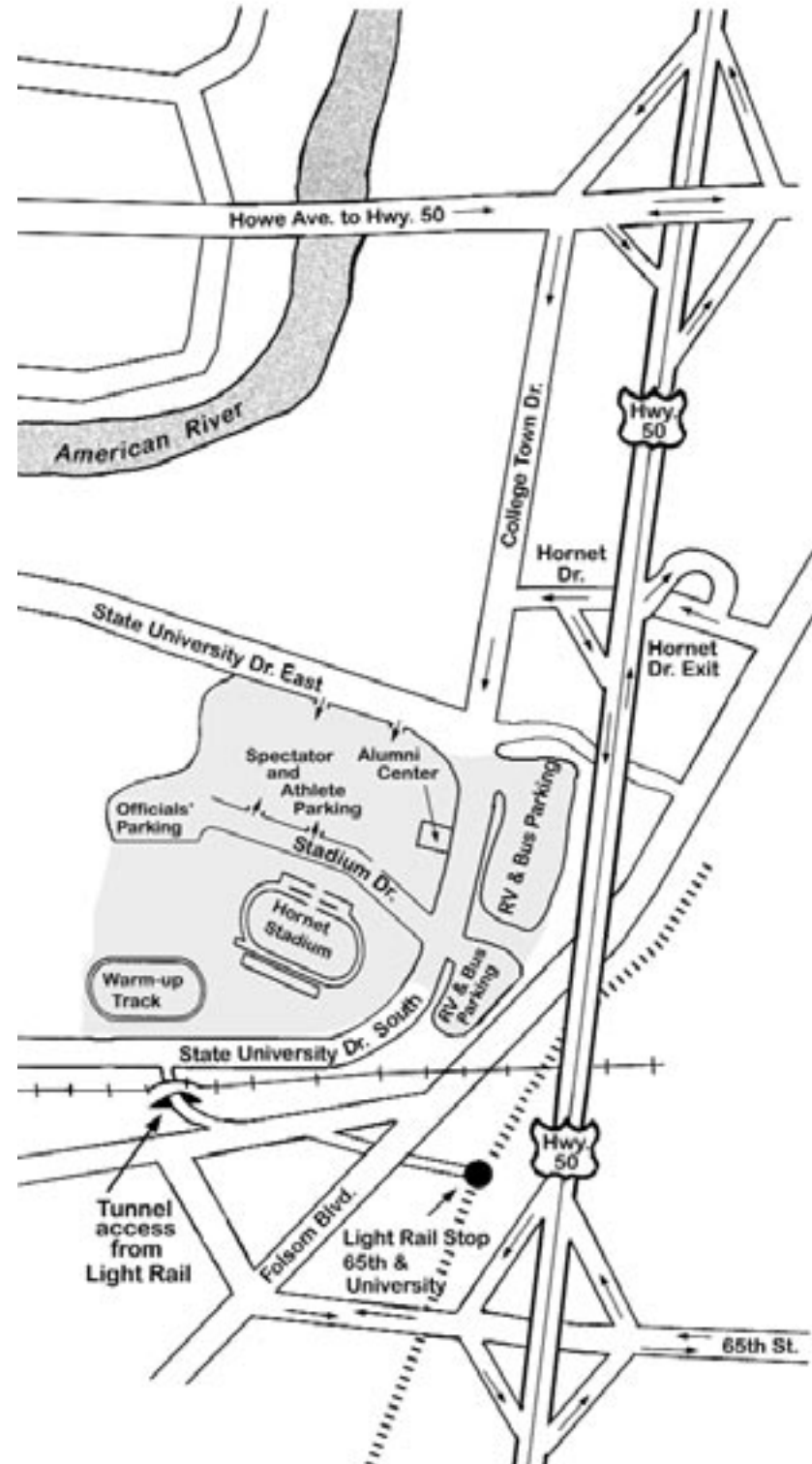

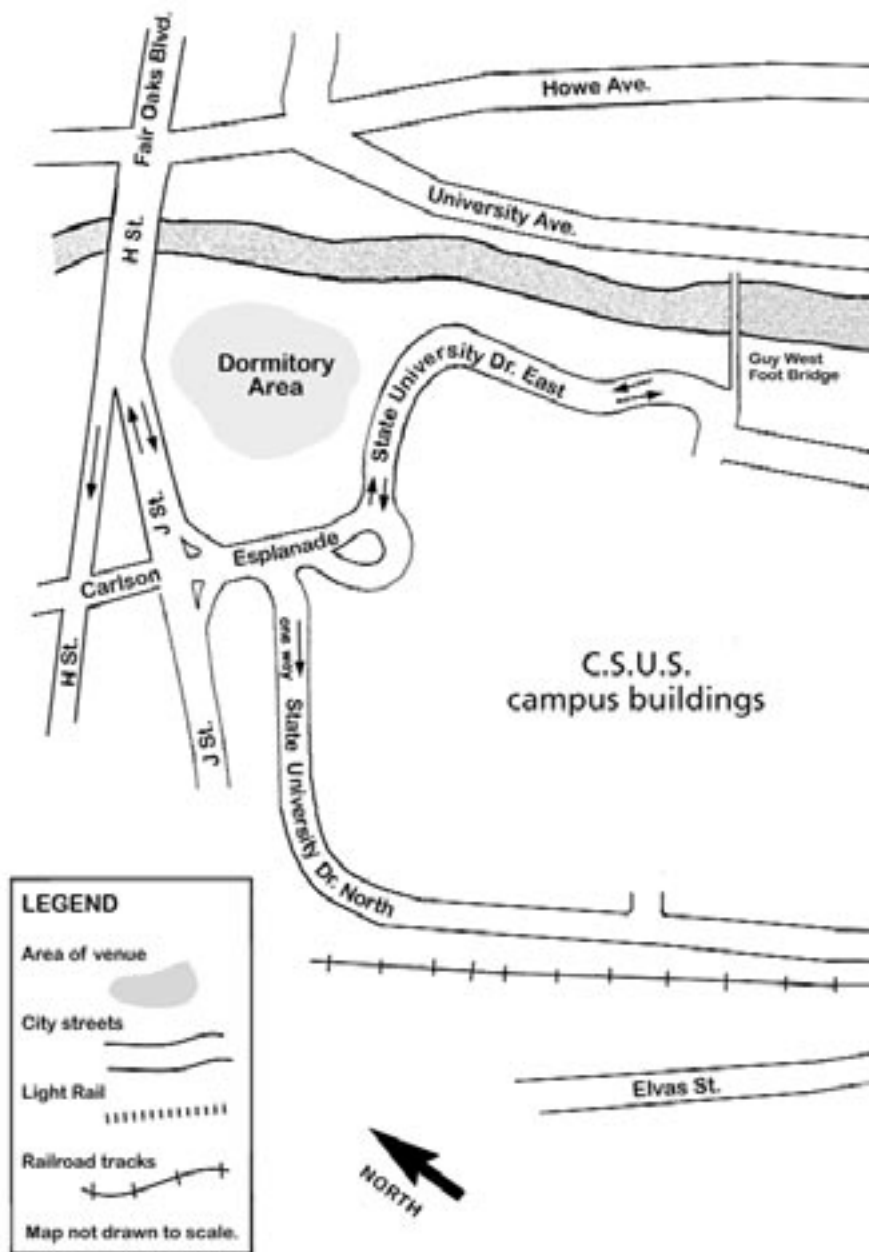

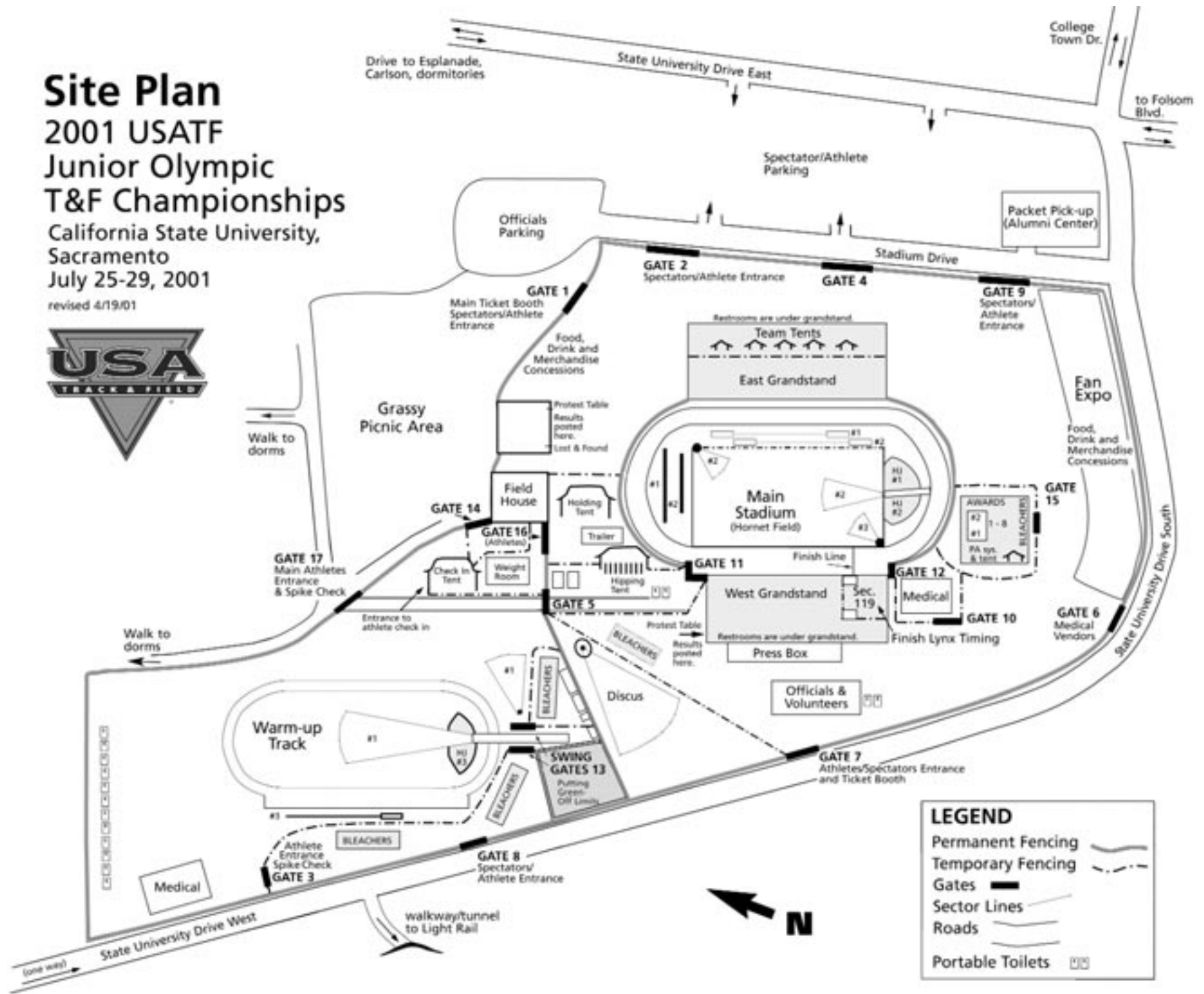
