

USA Track & Field, Inc (“USATF”) is committed to improving the safety of athletes as well as their physical, emotional and social development and to ensuring that athletes can participate in sport in an environment free of misconduct.

To this end, USTAF requires its sanctioned events to refrain from all forms of misconduct, which include without limitation:

- All forms of sexual misconduct, including child sexual abuse
- Emotional misconduct
- Physical misconduct
- Bullying
- Harassment
- Hazing

It is a violation of the USATF’s safe sport policy to engage in any form of misconduct, and is also a violation of the safe sport policy if a USATF sanctioned event knows of misconduct, but takes no action to intervene. Sanctioned events are required to report violations of USATF’s safe sport policy and suspicions or allegations of child physical or sexual abuse.

USATF’s Safe Sport Policy is in accordance with the United States Olympic Committee’s Safe Sport Policy.
